Available electives include: Mission Perspectives (EM301), Ministry in Islamic Contexts (EM415), Ministry in Cross-Cultural Contexts (EM418), Intro to Church-based Children's Ministry (DM320), Foundations for Youth Ministry (DM310), the Bible in Context field trip (BB445), Apologetics (PE420), or a Project in any field.

If a student wishes to change their pathway after completing the first year in the General Pathway, they may do so with approval from QTC, through the Registrar. Part-time students complete the same units as listed above but over a period of up to 9 years.
