The above set requirements represent a complete course that will lead to the award of the GradDipDiv – General Pathway, within the timeframe indicated.

Graduate Diploma of Divinity students may replace their second foundational OT and/or NT unit with an exegesis unit, provided they gained at least a credit grade in their first foundational unit.

Available electives include: New Testament Greek (LA004A&B), Synoptic Gospels-English (NT620), Exilic Prophecy-English (OT623), Fourth Gospel-English (NT624), Psalms-English (OT626), Romans – English (NT629), Pentateuch–English (OT620), Other Writings - English (NT628), Former Prophets-English (OT621), Foundations for Youth Ministry (DM510), Introduction to Children’s Ministry (DM520), Ministry in Islamic Contexts (EM615), Ministry in a Culturally Diverse Context (EM618), Mission Perspectives (EM501), Australian Church History (CH609), History of Evangelical Christianity (CH625), Early Church History (CH505), Philosophy (PE625), Christian Apologetics (PE620), The Bible in Context field trip (NT645), Christian Worship (PC515), Chaplaincy Skills – Schools or Aged Care (PC652), Pastoral Skills and Methods (PC603), CCEF Counselling Training. Students wishing to take additional electives may enrol to complete an MDiv General Pathway.

If a student wishes to change their pathway after completing their first year in the General Pathway, they may do so with approval from QTC, through the Registrar.

Part-time students complete the same units as listed above but over a period of up to 4 years. Attention should be paid to ACT prerequisites: see the ACT Postgraduate Handbook for details.
